1. Extension And Renovation St. Benedict, Kibuuka Memorial Preparatory Primary School Kiwaawo. **Long term Objective:** To facilitate effective and efficient education in the community.

Specific Objectives:

- To improve on the school structure in order to create a physical conducive environment for effective learning by the 12th month of the project.
- To help young people adopt positive behavior change by; creating awareness on Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs), early marriages & unintended pregnancies.
- To carry out career guidance & Income Generating Activities (IGAs) in schools around Kyamulibwa.

The project started on 1st May, 2019. The construction work is done by a professional contractor; BAM Building Construction with support from the school parents and community members. The construction is supervised by a professional Engineer who ensures the work is done in accordance with the BoQs (Bills of Quantities). The Engineer is supported by the KAP management, KAP Education projects committee and the school building committee. The Engineer makes a report for the performance of the project and recommends for the next phase.



The construction work is progressing on well. As of September 2019 the roofing construction, internal and external plastering, and shuttering of the new classroom block are completed. The toilet is already covered with the roof. Shuttering and plastering (both internal and external) of the three classroom blocks for renovation are almost completed. We hope to meet the deadline.

2. Model Farm Project

In addition to already existing Income Generating Activities in the model farm are:

- 1. Coronal coffee mother garden consisting of 350 seedlings of seven species. This was established by the partnership between United Friends Benefits (UFB) and KAP.
- 2. Quarter an acre of sweet bananas has been planted for export through the Biofresh Company Limited in a twelve monthperiod.

3. PROMOTING HEALTHY EATING AND INCOME LEVELS IN LOCAL COMMUNITIES (HEILCo)

Goal: The overall objective of this project is to *improve households' nutrition needs, income and overall standards of living*.

OBJECTIVES

The project intervention will have the specific objective below;

- 1. To support 60 households of old people's standard of living through training of organic piggery by the 2nd month of the project.
- 2. To promote organic farming through the use of basics of animal rearing and crop growing by the 12th month of the project.
- 3. To equip at least 25 households of old people with piglets by the 11th month of the project

Objective one has been achieved; households have constructed their own pig sties. Some of the pigs have given birth to a total of 12piglets (four female and 8 male). We have so far given female piglets to four beneficiaries and some male piglets will be sold for the sustainability of the project. We are happy to report that another pig delivered ten piglets (seven females and three males). They are all very healthy and the females will be given to the beneficiaries in November 2019

4. Fellowship Projects

People with similar interest come together and work together to achieve that interest. There is a group of 8 members who have come together to do a poultry. The team paid membership and is required to pay annual subscription for maintenance of the poultry. The group selected one of the members to manage the operations of the poultry. The team trained in the biosecurity, animal welfare, feed delivery and daily card reports.
