Activities done in the months of May, June & July 2019

Activity .1

• STATUS OF THE PIGLETS AT THE KAP MODEL FARM

The pigs in the farm are very healthy and progressing on well. They are under a permanent caretaker who is taking good care of them.

Objective one has been achieved: Households have started to construct their own pigsties. Some pigs have given birth to 12 piglets (eight are female and four are male). Eight households have been equipped with piglets.



Some pigs are conceived and some delivered as you may see in the above photos



Constructed pigsties by the household members, head of household receiving a piglet from farm and one of the beneficiaries is very happy with piglet from the farm.

Activity. 2

Diagnosis and basic treatment:

The veterinary doctor makes regular visits to the farm for medical checkups and treatment. The pigs are free from swine fever. He recommends cleanness in the farm and its surroundings as the best way of preventing infections.





Activity. 3

• Home visits to the Beneficiaries.

The coordinator together with the extension worker has made regular home visits. Beneficiaries are trained on the preparation of the organic feeds and how to care for the pigs.

Most beneficiaries have constructed their own pigsties as one of the requirements of receiving piglets from KAP and they are prepared for the project.

Recommendation

- > Organize more pasture for the pigs.
- > To retain the male piglets for a least six months so as to get substantial return in terms of income for the sustainability of the project.

KAP Health committee coordinator and the Health Committee will continue the exercise of monitoring and as well supervise the pig project selected beneficiaries on how to properly construct the pig sties at their home stead.

Way forward

During the next months, the following are to be done;

- 1. Plant more grass for the pigs
- 2. Write a progress report on the status of pigs at KAP model farm
- 3. Project coordinator continues with field visits
- 4. Among others
